General Information

- A complete commercial crumble (diet) providing all requirements for growing game birds
- Suitable to be fed to all breeds of game birds from 4 - 6 weeks of age to desired market weight
- The diet should be fed ad-lib to all birds, no other supplement is required
- Fresh, clean water to be accessible at all times
- Feed intake will vary at times, due to climate, bird health / stress and general housing of young birds
- Average consumption will vary according to breed and time fed to achieve target weights

- *Growth rates will vary according to a range of external factors including housing, variable weather conditions, predators, inoculations and hygiene to name a few*
- *Phase supplementary feeding both in and out gradually to help avoid set backs.*
- *Young stock are very susceptible to cold and draughts, housing should be well vented but draught free*
- *Ensure clean, cool water is accessible at all times*
- *Feeders and waterers needs to be easily accessible and cleaned of litter on a regular basis*
